THE YEAR IN REVIEW:

ST. LOUIS AREA FOODBANK ACQUIRES FOOD DISTRIBUTION CENTER IN BRIDGETON

In August of 2006, the St. Louis Area Foodbank acquired a 92,000-square-foot building located in Earth City. Our new facility enables the organization to increase food distribution to those in need throughout 14 counties in eastern Missouri and 12 counties in southwestern Illinois. Since 1975, the St. Louis Area Foodbank has partnered with more than 500 charitable agencies - senior centers, daycare centers, domestic abuse centers, soup kitchens, and food pantries - to feed those in the St. Louis community most in need - the sick, the elderly, and the very young. "We have been challenged for space since 2000 and had to lease additional warehousing in order to accept the food donations being

offered," said Frank Finnegan, St. Louis Area Foodbank executive director. "To keep up with the growing need for food assistance, we must now consolidate into one facility with the capacity to meet longer-term needs."

When the Foodbank established its headquarters at 5959 St. Louis Avenue in 1985, it distributed 3 million pounds of food and household items annually. Since 2000, the Foodbank's annual distribution has hovered between 12 and 13 million pounds, while the amount of product available to food banks across the country has increased 29 percent.

To offset the costs of the new facility, the Foodbank announced its community campaign "Fighting Hunger, Feeding Hope." The Boeing Company kicked off the campaign with a lead gift of \$1.5 million. "The Boeing Company contributed to the new facility not only because the Foodbank leads the fight against hunger in our region but also because it has a reputation for leading effective programs and being fiscally responsible," said John Van Gels, vice president, Boeing Integrated Defense Systems Operations and Supplier Management. "Boeing has a long tradition of supporting the communities where our employees live and work, and we are proud to support the Foodbank."

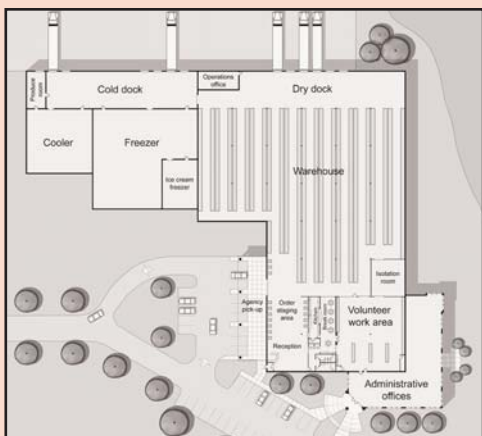
The United Way, the St. Louis Area Foodbank, the Salvation Army and the Red Cross came together in July 2006 to help ensure that those on low and fixed incomes, particularly the elderly and those with medical needs and disabilities, who were affected by the summer storms had an emergency supply of nutritious food for themselves and their families.

Each emergency food box contained staple items and provided approximately 30 meals. Close to 1.5 million meals were provided.


"The Foodbank helps feed more than 60,000 local individuals each week," said Frank Finnegan, executive director of the St. Louis Area Foodbank. "Our challenge was to replenish items lost in the power outage at many of the community feeding programs we serve so they could continue our mission to feed hungry people."

FROM THE PRESIDENT AND DIRECTOR



The decision to relocate was relatively easy for the Board of the Directors. First and foremost, there are 60,000 people in our community that rely on the food we distribute each week (and it does not appear that number will significantly decrease in the near future).



Second, the old location lacked the space to store all the food donations available to feed them. As an organization committed to fighting hunger, how in good conscience could we do anything else but secure a larger facility? The decision was not when, but where.

The board is composed of volunteers committed to the Foodbank's mission of fighting hunger and equally committed to being good stewards. Therefore the criteria for a new site had many priorities: a warehouse that would serve the community for the next fifty years; a safe location for our 5,000 volunteers; easy access to the highway system for

semi-trucks and partner agencies; and perhaps most importantly, a site that allows us to be good stewards with the funds entrusted to us.

We inspected twenty-six sites located throughout the metropolitan area and created cost comparisons on the top five choices. The site selected is located in the Earth City Business Park, a premier location for distribution companies. It is safe, convenient, and offers highway access in all directions. The 92,800-square-foot building is twelve years old with 30-foot ceilings. It has existing freezer, cooler and dry storage, 13 docks, and sits on 13.5 acres with ground available for future expansion. Finally, it should hold or increase in value relative to the future real estate market. In other words, it meets the good stewardship standard we continually strive to achieve.

refrigerated truck. The truck assists in our daily deliveries to food pantries and soup kitchens.

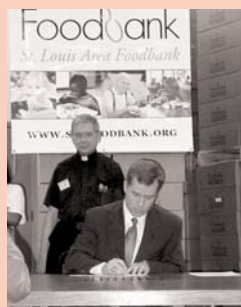
HUNGER ADVOCACY DAY

Each year, representatives from the St. Louis Area Foodbank and the Missouri Food Bank Association meet with state representatives in Jefferson City to discuss statewide hunger issues. In March 2006, the Foodbank bussed 20 representatives from our network of community-based feeding programs to Jefferson City to meet with elected officials about pending legislation that affects Foodbank's clients, including House bills to raise the minimum wage and provide tax credits to food pantries.

We're pleased to report that both important bills passed.

GOVERNOR BLUNT VISITS FOODBANK TO SIGN HUNGER- RELIEF BILL

Missouri Governor Matt Blunt visited the St. Louis Area Foodbank on June 6, 2006



- National Hunger Awareness Day - to sign into law House Bill 1559 which adds grocery and convenience stores to the list of donors that can donate food to a charity or nonprofit

organization for distribution without being liable for damages resulting from the food's condition.

"Last year I visited the St. Louis Area Foodbank and witnessed firsthand the compassionate spirit of this organization as they work to feed the hungry," Blunt said. "This bill expands the pool of existing food donors and will help ensure safe, adequate food makes it to the tables of those in need instead of being tossed in the trash."

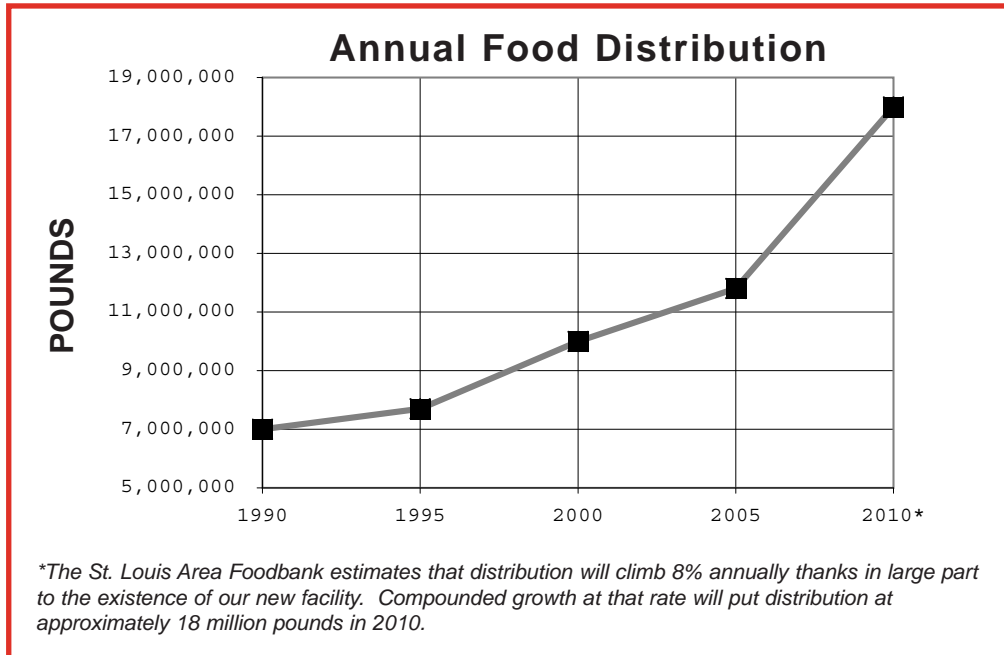

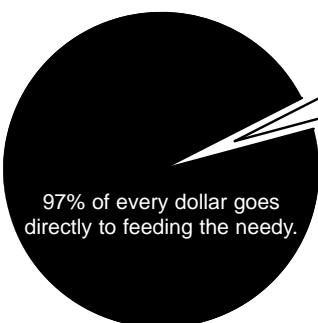
